English

Students will read "The Twits" by Roald Dahl. They will analyse the language features used by the author to set the scene and build tension. They will also learn how to create their own humorous new chapter based on a prank by Mr and Mrs Twit.

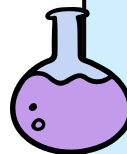


Mathematics

Students will learn the properties of odd and even numbers to follow and create algorithms and identify patterns. Students will explore different types of angles, investigate shapes and objects in the environment and identify lines of symmetry in different shapes. They will use grid references to locate places on simple maps.

Science

Students will explore the properties of everyday materials. They will test, compare, and describe materials based on features such as strength, flexibility, absorbency and resistance to heat or water.



Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS)

Students use grid references on maps to identify the location of landmarks of different countries. They will investigate the similarities and differences of different environments and interpret data to describe patterns.

Technologies

Students will explore where food comes from, healthy options and designing packaging. They will also learn about testing materials, designing, creating/producing and reflecting.

The Arts

In Music, students will compose, perform and respond to music by exploring the ways music can represent characters and their actions.



Health & Physical Education (HPE)

Students will learn about influences that strengthen their identity and develop strategies to overcome emotions and change. They will learn fundamental skills of volleyball and solve movement challenges using strategy, cooperation and fair play.
