Western Cape College plans to maximise the success of every *Day* and *Boarding* students, through embedding evidence-driven, whole-College approaches to support wellbeing. Current evidence supports the premise that *when staff and student wellbeing is supported - learning and achievement is enhanced*. Current national forecasting suggests schools will see a spike in concerns for students' wellbeing over the next 12 to 14 months.

## Our initiatives include

Our approach to student learning and wellbeing across the whole College will include:

1. Strengthening our safe, supportive and inclusive environment.
2. Building the capability of staff, students and the College community.
3. Developing strong *systems* for early interventions in learning and wellbeing.
4. The co-design of a strong community engagement *Social Performance Model*.

## Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Recognising the early signs that a student's wellbeing is at risk and responding appropriately by noticing, inquiring and planning (Student and Learning Framework, Department of Education).
- Responding positively to the needs of different groups within the College community.
- Explicitly teaching and modelling social and emotional skills, values and expectations for behaviour to support student wellbeing.
- Strengthening connections with parents and our broader communities to support early intervention for students whose wellbeing is at risk.
- Enhancing College-wide and interagency systems that support staff to respond to students at risk.
- Enhance processes to maximise student well-being across key transition points.
- Enhance consistent pedagogical practices across the College by collaborating on teaching and learning and leading.
