Our purpose is to improve education, health, and employment outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young women.

The primary objective of our Programs is to provide targeted engagement incentives through rich relationship-based mentoring and holistic support to encourage First Nations young women to remain in school and actively engaged in education until completion of Year 12, and then support them to transition successfully into further study or employment.

To be successful in this role you need to have a passion for and ability to engage positively with youth. You will be a positive role model for female Aboriginal students and enjoy working in a small, high-performing team. You will be committed to the mission and purpose of Stars Foundation and can work closely with our partner school's management, student support services, teachers, and parents to provide wrap-around, holistic support to the Stars students.
